Adoption Agreement

The goal of the Greater Houston Pembroke Welsh Corgi Fanciers (GHPWCF) Rescue Program is to provide for the safety and wellbeing of pure bred Pembroke Welsh Corgis (Corgis) by placing dogs from our Rescue Program in appropriate, permanent homes. Full disclosure of the information requested above will greatly enhance the GHPWCF's ability to find a suitable dog for you.

Completion of this Adoption Agreement with signatures by both parties shall release the GHPWCF and its Rescue Representative(s) from all liability or responsibility for the dog. However, the GHPWCF provides a reasonable guarantee for the well being of the dog and **will accept the Corgi back into its rescue program if the dog is not working out as expected by the adopting home. The adopters agree not to sell, trade, transfer ownership, abandon, or dispose of this Corgi in any way, but shall notify GHPWCF Rescue and relinquish custody of this dog back to the Club's Rescue Representative(s). This includes placement with family members.**

The GHPWCF reserves to right to make periodic follow-up checks with the new owner(s) to ease any adjustment problems the dog or new owner(s) may incur. The GHPWCF shall endeavor to help the new owner(s) in every reasonable way. Fenced yards, obedience classes and crate training are highly recommended. All Corgis adopted through the GHPWCF must be spayed or neutered and live primarily in the domicile of the family as a household pet and companion.

The GHPWCF requires a **minimum donation of \$300.⁰⁰** for corgis adopted through our rescue program. This amount may vary depending upon the veterinary needs of the dog.

I acknowledge that all the information contained in this application is true and correct to the best of my knowledge. I understand that falsifying answers on this application, or at any other time during the adoption process, will disqualify me (us) from adopting a rescue through the GHPWCF.
